Officer Borowski urges Wilde Lake residents to call the police to report all incidents. He also reminds residents to contact the police if they see something suspicious. Call 911 for emergencies or 410/313-2200 for non-emergencies.

HCPD is encouraging residents to use the Neighbors by Ring app which lets people share, view and comment on crime and security information in their communities.
