

Highlights of September 9 Wilde Lake Village Board Meeting

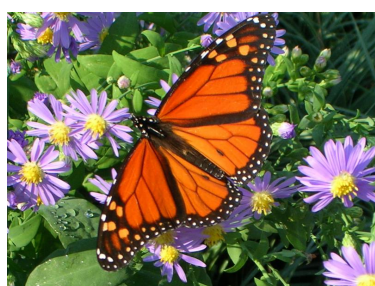
- The Board heard a presentation about Streets for All in Howard County and voted to join the Streets for All Coalition

Covenant Reminder!

Did you know that the Wilde Lake Village Covenants require property owners to store trash containers out of view except on scheduled pick up days?

The Property Standards Evaluator has cited many properties for having trash and recycling bins stored in front of the house. As a result, many residents, in particular townhouse owners, have asked about screening for containers. In general, installing screening is allowed but must be approved by the Wilde Lake Architectural Committee first.
