Tips on Having a Yard Sale during COVID-19

Are you planning a yard sale this fall? Here are some recommendations from the Howard County Health Department:

- Customers and yard sale participants will be strongly encouraged to wear masks
Spacing items, considering a natural flow of potential customers are things to consider to avoid cramped areas

of interaction.

- Limit direct contact of items or have ways to clean items after contact. Yard sale participants may wish to have a sanitizer station at the entry to their property.
- One person should be in charge of payments and wear gloves or frequently wash hands/use sanitizer after individual transactions
- Yard sale participants should take care in who is interfacing with potentially unknown customers. People with profiles of potentially higher risk categories would be advised to limit those interactions, especially given the potential of asymptomatic customers.

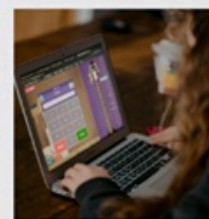
Back To School Supply Drive
