

Why National Domestic Violence Awareness Month Is Important

1. **It inspires change** - National Domestic Violence Awareness Month encourages those in abusive relationships to get help. The month isn't just about learning, it's about doing.
2. **Victims need our support** - Millions of Americans are domestic violence victims. They need our support to move beyond the abuse.

1850 - Tennessee outlawed violence against spouses. Other states followed suit shortly thereafter.

1978 - The National Coalition Against Domestic Violence was established.

1987 - The First National Domestic Violence Awareness Month - the push for change began.

1994 - Congress passed the Violence Against Women Act ("VAWA"). This Act, and the 1996 additions to the Act, recognize that domestic violence is a national crime and that federal laws can help an overburdened state and local criminal justice system.

2010 - According to a CDC survey, 20 Americans experience intimate partner physical violence every minute. That totals around 10 million victims per year.



4 Signs You're Experiencing Abuse

*Your partner threatens or tries to control you - this can be anything from making you feel inadequate to telling you what to wear or how to look.

*Your partner controls your money - keeping cash or credit cards from you or discouraging you from working is unacceptable.

*Your partner isolates you - cutting you off from family and friends make you even more dependent on your partner and could be a sign of abuse.

*Your partner physically abuses you - this is a serious crime regardless of your relationship status.

Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women - more than car accidents, muggings, and rapes combined. Every 9 seconds in the United States a woman is assaulted or beaten. Every year, 1 in 3 women who is a victim of homicide is murdered by her current or former partner.
