Covenant Enforcement in Wilde Lake

Are you worried about the state of a home or yard in your neighborhood? Dreading a potentially awkward conversation with a neighbor? WLCA is here to help. We depend on observant residents to help us maintain Wilde Lake's high aesthetic standards. Here are a few notes about how the covenant enforcement process works in our village:

- Have a concern? Call or email Lexi Levy Milani, covenant advisor. All inquiries remain 100% confidential.
- Lexi will visit the property to determine what violations, if any, exist.
- Violations will be documented in a letter sent to the property owner's official mailing address as shown in state taxation records. Owners have 30 days to contact Lexi.
- If no contact is made, Lexi reinspects the property after the 30-day period has ended and sends another letter if necessary. Owners are given another 30-day period to remedy the situation.
- At the 60-day mark, the matter may be escalated to the Wilde Lake Village Board to

take further action.

The process is built to encourage compliance and allow property owners ample time to correct any violations. It may not be speedy - but it is generally quite effective. We appreciate your assistance in keeping Wilde Lake a lovely place to live!

June Health & Wellness



June is National Migraine & Headache Awareness Month, an opportunity to raise awareness about migraine and other headache diseases. Migraine is a complex neurologic disease that has been identified as the leading cause of years lived with disability in people under the age of 50 years. It directly affects more than 1 billion people worldwide with huge socioeconomic impact. Although migraine affects three times more women than men, it can be equally disabling in both genders. Migraine often starts at puberty and mostly affects adults in their productive years, but it can also be present in children and the elderly. Chronic migraine affects approximately 2% of the world population. Migraine and chronic headache is found to be the second most frequently identified cause of short-term absence from non-manual employees, and amongst the five leading causes of emergency department visits.

<u>When To See a Doctor</u>: 1) You usually have two or more headaches a week. 2) You take a pain reliever for your headache most days. 3) Your headaches are disabling. 4) You need more that the recommended dose of over-the-counter pain remedies to relieve your headaches. 5) Your headache pattern changes or your headaches worsen.

Seek Prompt Medical Care if your Headache: 1) Is sudden and severe. 2) Gets worse despite rest and pain medication. 3) Follows a head injury. 4) Accompanies a fever, stiff neck, confusion, seizure, double vision, weakness, numbness or difficulty speaking.
